October is DOUGHNUT TIME! Doughnuts are on display at neighborhood grocery stores and bakeries. Halloween, you know! If you like to make your own—

Here is a basic DOUGHNUT RECIPE

Beat 4 egg yolks or 2 whole eggs until light. Add 1 cup sugar. Beat mixture for 2 minutes. Stir together 2 cups sifted all purpose flour or 4 cups pastry flour, 1/2 cup baking powder, 1/2 salt, 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 cup oil, 1/2 cup water. Add dry ingredients to liquid and mix together until well blended. Chill dough 1 hour in 1/2 inch thickness. Cut with dough cutter. Fry in heated fat—375° Stir doughnuts from spatula into hot fat. Fry on each side until golden brown. Remove, drain on absorbent paper.

**SPECIAL TRICKS FOR DOUGHNUT TREATS:**

Drizzle warm doughnuts in granulated or powdered sugar, add cinnamon or chopped nuts. Use if you like. Try adding 3 tablespoons grated orange rind and substitute orange juice for the milk. While warm, dip doughnuts in powdered sugar. Add maple flavoring and chopped nuts, or warm vanilla or chocolate sauce. Do not use cream. Let doughnuts cool in hot fat and have drop doughnuts.
