

Malheur Dairy Breeders Annual Meeting Nov. 28

The annual meeting of the Malheur Dairy Breeders association Monday, Nov. 28 will feature a tour to view two outstanding dairy herds, a huge dinner at noon at Boulevard Grange hall and election of new directors.

From 10:30 a.m. until 12 all interested people are invited to visit the Harold Main farm to view his Jersey herd and the Lee and Leo Monce place with its Holstein stock. The Main farm is located four miles west of the Ontario Sale yard, last house on the right side of the road or 2 miles north and one-fourth mile east of Lincoln school. The Monce place will be found three miles west of the old Cairo school or one mile north of Lincoln school. "Directional signs will be posted," an association representative stated.

The Dairy Breeders plan to serve a bounteous dinner to several hundred people at 12 o'clock at Boulevard Grange. Door prizes will also be given. Following dinner Professor Harold Ewald of Oregon State College will speak on sire selection and why they are using these special sires.

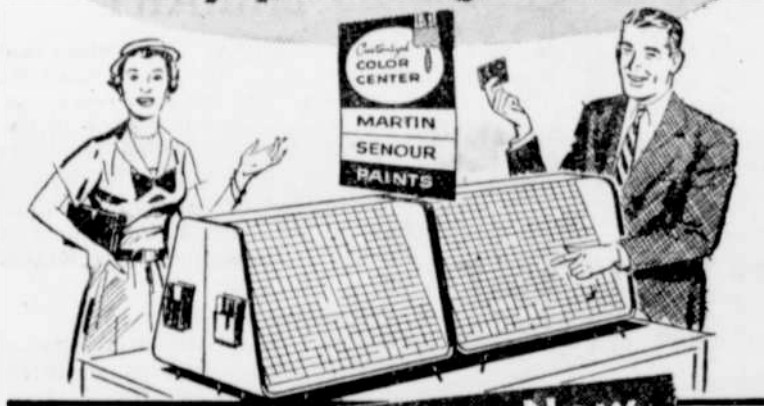
