A Roy B. and Ada L. Tupper owed Uncle Sam a \$64,843 income tax bill for 1947-48, but they apparently "didn't feel inclined to pay it" on time like most other tax payers do. The internal revenue service last week accepted an offer of \$15,000 from the couple who can "hold up their heads" as honest American citizens with all the privileges and benefits this nation can provide.

We don't suggest that a family who owes \$400 refuse to pay until the internal revenue service agrees to settle for \$92, but our congressmen should be reminded that such benefits should be extended to the lower income brackets if "offers" are going to be accepted.
