Talking Turkey!



Full-flavored turkey for the holiday buffet begins with the selection, cooking and seasoning. Firm, full-fleshed turkey should be roasted at low temperature and only until done. Ac'cent, shaken liberally into the cavity, brings out maximum cooked flavor.

To Roast Turkey: Rinse bird thoroughly in cold water; pat dry. Shake Ac'cent liberally into cavity. Then fill bird with your favorite stuffing. Rub skin lightly with fat. Truss. Place bird in shallow roasting pan, breast up. Roast at 325°F. (Bird may be covered with a soft cloth moistened with fat.) Cool quickly.

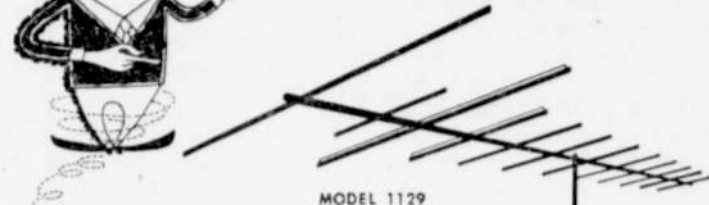

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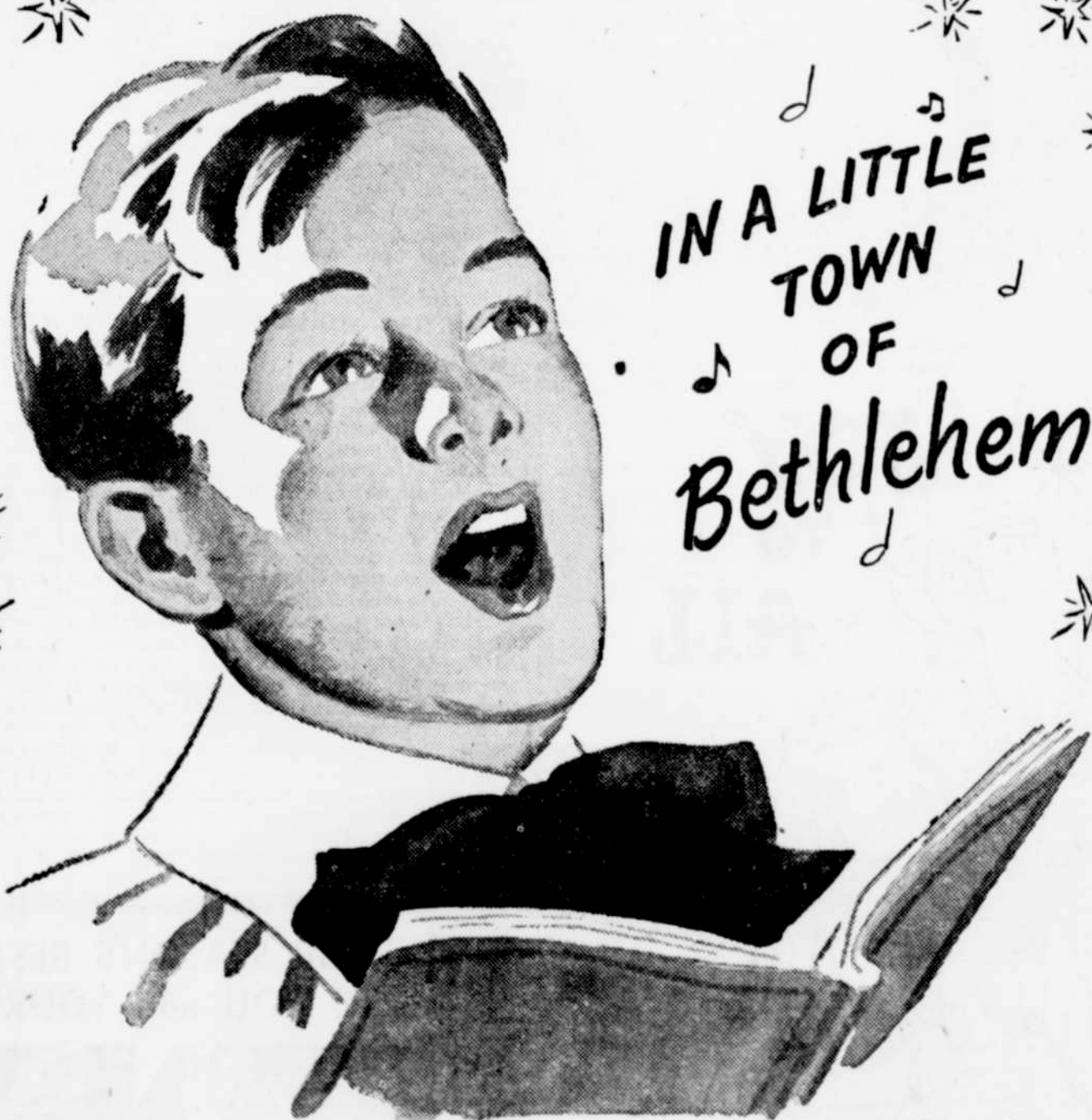
