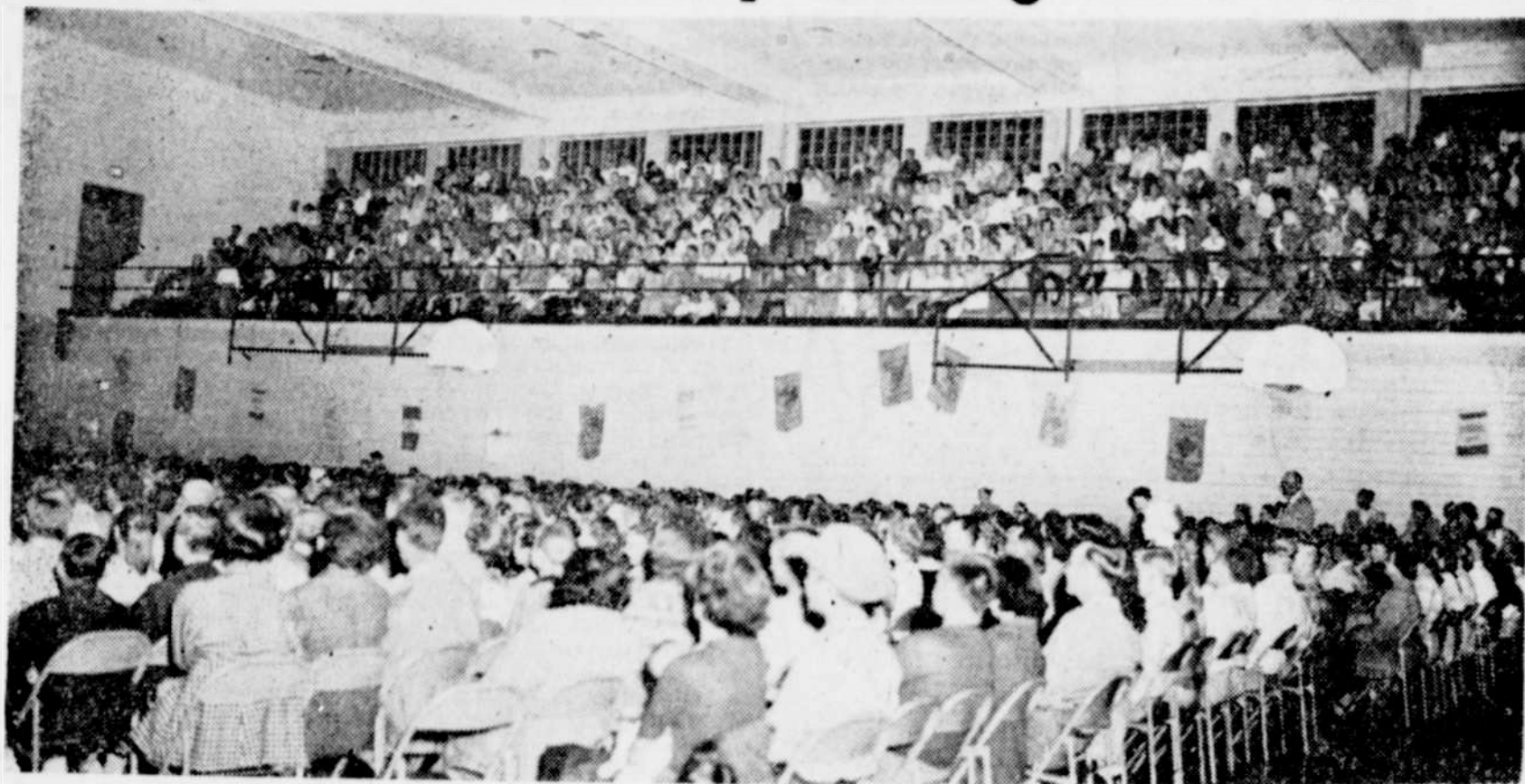


Pictures In the News High-Light Activities Of Nyssa Community During Past Year

Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Hatch began housekeeping in the old house in 1901 and it was the birthplace of all their children. They sold it to Mr. and Mrs. Amos Prosser of Star in the spring of 1918. It was there that the three Elmer Prosser children were born and reared.
