Channel Catfish In Snake River Grow Large

Reports from the Snake river area indicate that the channel catfish there are making as good if not better growth than their eastern cousins in the Mississippi drainage.

According to Homer Campbell, northeast fishery agent for the Oregon Game commission, surveys conducted along the Snake river this fall show that channel catfish are reaching the "sock-a-lodger" size. An attempt to determine age and growth of channel catfish has resulted in the examination of 37 of the Snake river fish taken in various areas from the mouth of the Imnaha river to Ontario. The largest group ranged in length from 7.5 to 9.5 inches and were in their third year of life. The next largest group, also 3-year fish, ranged from 13 to 18.5 inches in length. Six-year-old fish were from 22 to 24 inches in length and weighed roughly about seven pounds.

The grand-pappy of the 37-fish sample was an 11-year-old catfish measuring 31 inches in length and weighed 14 pounds.

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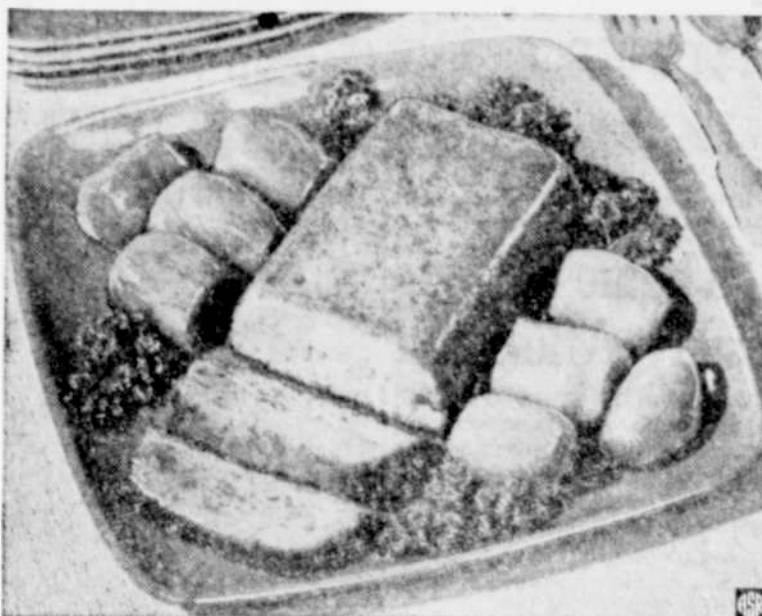
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Delectable And Different Ham Loaf



Plentiful pork and pork products can help you put more pennies in your "piggy bank" if you include them frequently in your menus now and in the months ahead. Your meals can be varied and interesting while you effect savings in your food budget. Here's an idea for leftover cooked or baked ham—a delectable and different Pickle Stuffed Ham Loaf. Evaporated milk is the binder and moistening agent for the nicely seasoned ham layers, which are stretched with a zesty pickle layer in the middle.

This is a really thrifty meal, and evaporated milk is a valuable ingredient product in this and similar meat loaves. Because it is whole milk concentrated to half its original volume and used here undiluted, evaporated milk is doubly rich, and therefore doubly nutritious. And it is fortified with vitamin D, the "sunshine vitamin" that helps the body make use of calcium and phosphorus which build bones and teeth.

Pickle Stuffed Ham Loaf
4 cups ground cooked ham, lightly packed
1 cup fine dry bread crumbs
1/2 teaspoon black pepper
1/2 teaspoon powdered thyme
1 cup finely chopped onion
1 egg
1 1/2 cups evaporated milk
1 teaspoon prepared mustard
1/2 to 3/4 cup pickle relish

Boiled or baked ham can be used. Put ham through medium blade of food chopper. Place ham in large mixing bowl. Add 1/2 cup of the fine dry bread crumbs, the pepper, thyme, onion; mix thoroughly. Beat in the egg and 1 cup of the evaporated milk. Divide ham mixture in half. Pack one half in bottom of a well greased loaf pan, about 2 1/4 x 8 1/2 x 4 1/4-inches. Stir mustard into the remaining 1/2 cup evaporated milk. Add the remaining 1/2 cup crumbs and pickle relish, and blend thoroughly. Spread pickle stuffing evenly and firmly on top of ham layer. Pack remaining half of ham mixture over pickle layer. Bake in moderate oven (375°F.) about 45 minutes.

YIELD: 6 generous servings.
