New Sugar Bill Will Benefit Growers In Area

No additional acreage for the 1956 sugar beet crop in the Nyssa-Nampa district is expected even if a new sugar quota bill passed by the U. S. Senate meets final approval, it was announced Wednesday by Jed Lewis, district manager of Amalgamated Sugar Co. He stated that the bill will add a fairly substantial amount of acreage after this year and is likely to surpass the 700 acres first calculated on basis of an original bill. No definite amount can be estimated at this time, Lewis said.

In a telegram received by the Journal from Sen. Richard L. Neuberger last Wednesday, it was stated that the senate had passed the new sugar quota bill Wednesday night. The bill "assures domestic sugar producers at least 55 percent of increased consumption of sugar. Beet sugar industry will benefit by approximately 40 percent of this increase in quota," Sen. Neuberger's telegram read.

He indicated that both Oregon senators supported the bill and opposed crippling amendments. "We naturally had in mind welfare of the sugar beet industry and its many employees in the Nyssa, Vale and Ontario region of Oregon," the senator stated.
