COLOR CLINIC

FINDING INSPIRATION FOR COLOR SCHEME:

Fabric or Wallpaper. In a floral pattern the color of the leaves would probably be a good choice for your floor covering with one of the deeper flower tones for upholstery. A lighter flower color could be used for one of the stripes in the drapery. The walls might be either a light tint from a smaller flower (or petal) or the background colors of the figured material.

Take your accent cut from an accent cue from an accent color in the design, or select it by finding the complementary contrast for your dominant color. This method can be followed whether the figured material is actually to be used in your room or is merely serving as a color inspiration—only be sure you have a large enough piece so that you can get a clear idea of the color tones.
