Tropicana Salad

(Makes 6-8 servings)

1 package (3 oz.) lemon-flavored gelatin or lime-flavored gelatin
1/2 cup boiling pineapple juice
1/2 cup boiling water
1/2 cup (1 small can) undiluted Carnation Evaporated Milk
2 tablespoons lemon juice

1 cup (211 can) canned drained pineapple chunks
1/2 cup chopped nuts
3 tablespoons chopped maraschino cherries
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup unpeeled chopped apples

Dissolve gelatin in boiling pineapple juice and water. Chill until thickened (about 20 minutes).
Chill Carnation in refrigerator tray until soft crystals form through milk (about 10-15 minutes). Whip chilled Carnation until stiff (about 1 minute); add 2 tablespoons lemon juice and continue whipping until very stiff (2 minutes longer). Combine pineapple, nuts, cherries, lemon juice, salt and apples in bowl. Fold in whipped Carnation and gelatin. Spoon into 1 1/2-quart mold. Chill until firm (about 2 hours).

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
