Prize winners for the afternoon were Mrs. Bert Lienkaemper and Mrs. Gorden Oxnam.

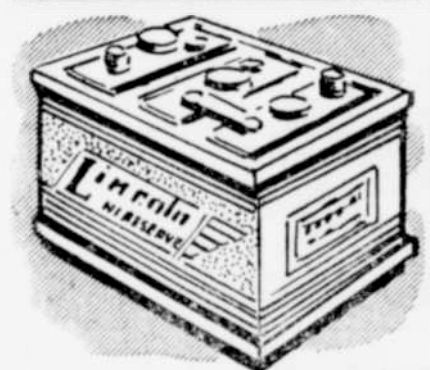

Mrs. John Olsen attended the wedding of Miss Elizabeth Huebener and Constant Chroves in Boise Saturday afternoon.

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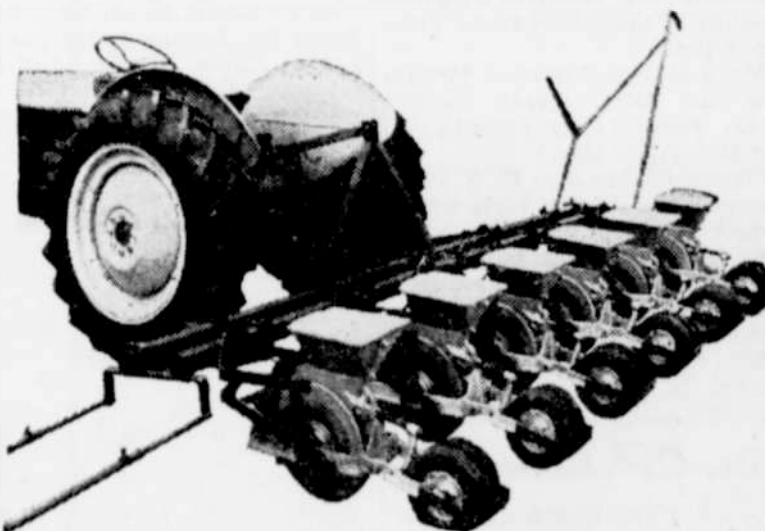
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
