Ontario Takes Over as Track Champs; Bulldogs to Host 3 Teams Tonight

The Nyssa Bulldogs were finally toppled from their lofty pedestal as kingpins of the Snake River Valley track and field competition since 1947 when a well-balanced Ontario team dominated track events at the SRV meet held at the Nyssa oval Friday night.

But even in losing the Bulldogs set the only new class "A" record when they clipped off the 440 yard relay in 47.2. The previous record had been set by Weiser in 1954 when they ran the distance in 47.7.

For the most part the Bulldog team was made up of sophomores and juniors and the close finishes in several of the events indicate that Nyssa has no intention of sharing second place honors with Weiser come another season.

Tonight at 7:15 Nyssa will again tangle with Ontario, Vale and Adrian in an annual meet. Events will include shot, high hurdles, pole vault, mile, discus, 100, broadjump, 440, javelin, low hurdles, high jump, 220, 880 yard run. Following the 880 and 440 relays will be held.

The above events will be run in the sequence printed.

Finish judges include Dick Tensen, Ray Larson, Bill Jarrett and Floyd Hale. Field judges will include Dwight Wyckoff, Eldon Farmer and Larry Schwarz.

Harry McGinley will act as clerk of the track, Jim Nally starter and Grant Rinehart announcer.

All events will be run as finals. Scores A-League: Ontario 41 3/5, Nyssa 32, Weiser 32, Vale 24, Meridian 17, Emmett 11 4/5, and Parma 6 3/5.
