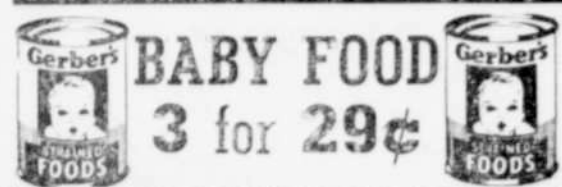

Citations Issued Following Wreck

Three citations were issued and two persons were given emergency treatment at Malheur Memorial hospital Monday afternoon following a two-car wreck north of Nyssa. Mrs. Nick Flores and Jesse Valero, 6-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Marillo Valero, were treated and released with reports of minor injuries. Mrs. Flores was riding in one of the cars involved and the youngster reportedly dashed from the same car in attempt to cross the highway after the wreck and ran into the side of a third car driven by A. M. Hammon.

According to police, Edward C. Larsson, driving a truck, attempted to turn left onto a side road and was hit by the car driven by Nick M. Flores, who allegedly attempted to pass while the turn was being made. Larsson was cited for having a defective signal device and paid a \$3 fine and costs in Justice Don M. Graham's court Tuesday. Flores was cited for passing at an intersection, but pleaded not guilty in the justice court Tuesday. Hammon was cited for reckless driving for allegedly failing to stop when signaled and he entered a not guilty plea. Graham said District Attorney E. Otis Smith has been notified and will set dates for hearing the two cases.
