

Search Begins For Grassman Of Year Contest

The search for Malheur county's Grassman of the Year will start this week, according to John Kennedy, chairman of the county Farm Bureau. Kennedy announced the appointment of Bill Moore as chairman of the contest and said that local business organizations will donate prizes for the county winners.

The purpose of the contest is to point out outstanding forage production practices used in the area, Moore explained. He said a

tour of winners' farms will be held to let the public observe their production methods.

There is more room for increased yields in pasture and forage crops than in any of our other crops, Moore pointed out. He cited pasture rotation, use of higher producing forage varieties, fertilizer use and other management factors which could double the carrying capacity of many present pastures. The Grassman of the Year contest is held to publicize these outstanding practices.

The top man of the local contest will compete for valuable prizes with other county winners for state honors. The state winner will be eligible to compete with Idaho and Washington for the title of northwest Grassman of the Year.

County farm and civic organizations are urged to select outstanding grassland farmers of their community and submit the names for the contest.

The winner of last year's contest was Lewis Wettstein of the Cairo community.
