The couple is residing in Lebanon and will return to Berkeley in the fall.

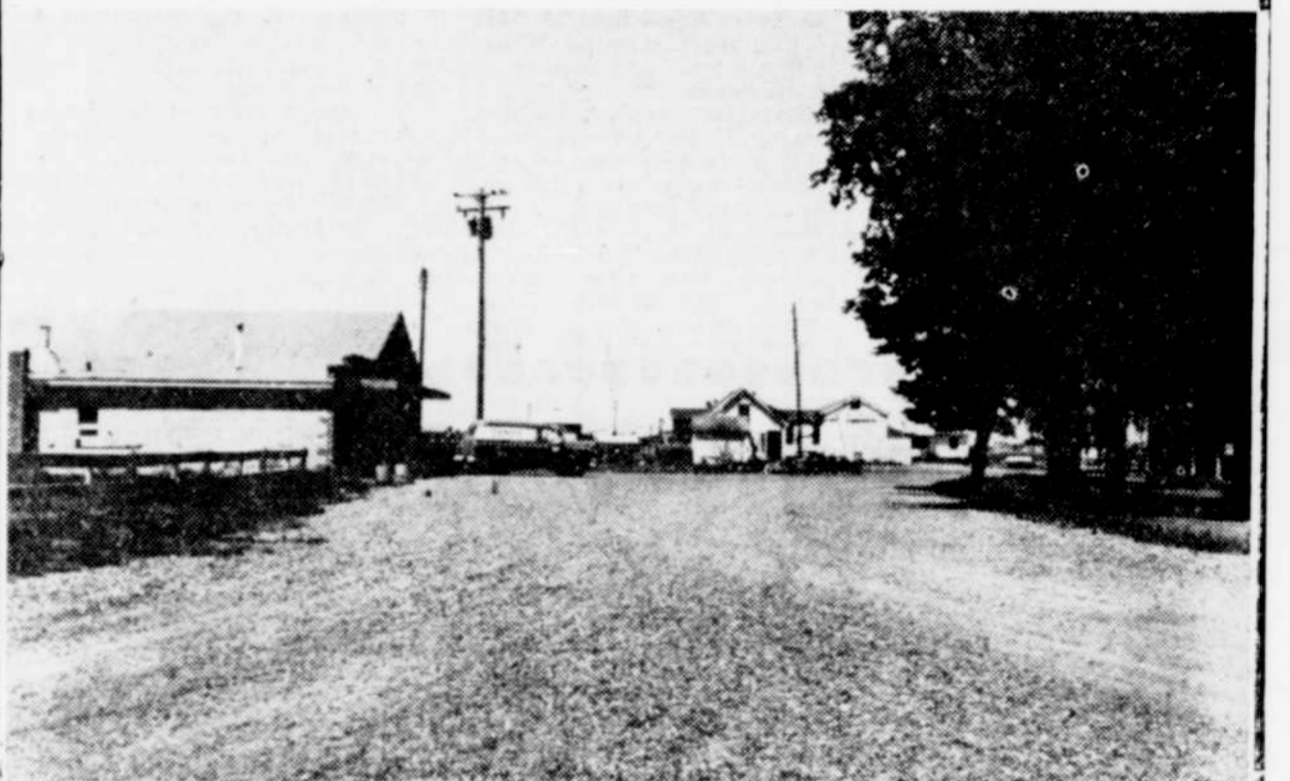
