COUNTY LIBRARY

Miss Marjorie Pomeroy, newly appointed Reading and Library Services chairman for the Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers, attended a meeting of PTA junior vice presidents with their chairmen in Portland, June 11. The meeting included checking plans of work and other business pertaining to the respective departments of the organization.

An average of more than a book per minute was checked out to rural borrowers at five stops when the Malheur County Library's station-wagon "bookmobile" began its fifth summer of rural traveling-library service June 5-8. A rousing 359 books circulated in approximately five hours spent at these rural stops.

Places visited by the station-wagon were Willowcreek, Pioneer, Newell Heights, Adrian, and Arcadia. The stops last for forty-five minutes to one hour. The second round of visits include Annex, Jefferson, Brogan, Jamie-son, Owyhee Junction, Sunset Valley, McCoy's Store, and Oregon Trail School. Both children and adults select books from the bookmobile, whose frequency of visits throughout the summer is every two weeks. Mimeographed schedules are available upon request.

The county library further serves rural areas by mailing books to far-off points not reached by bookmobile such as Ironside, Westfall, Beulah, and Jordan Valley. Over 200 books have been mailed during the first week of June to boys and girls in these outlying parts of the county who are taking part in the library-sponsored summer reading project. This figure represents only a part of the books yet to be mailed in this project.
