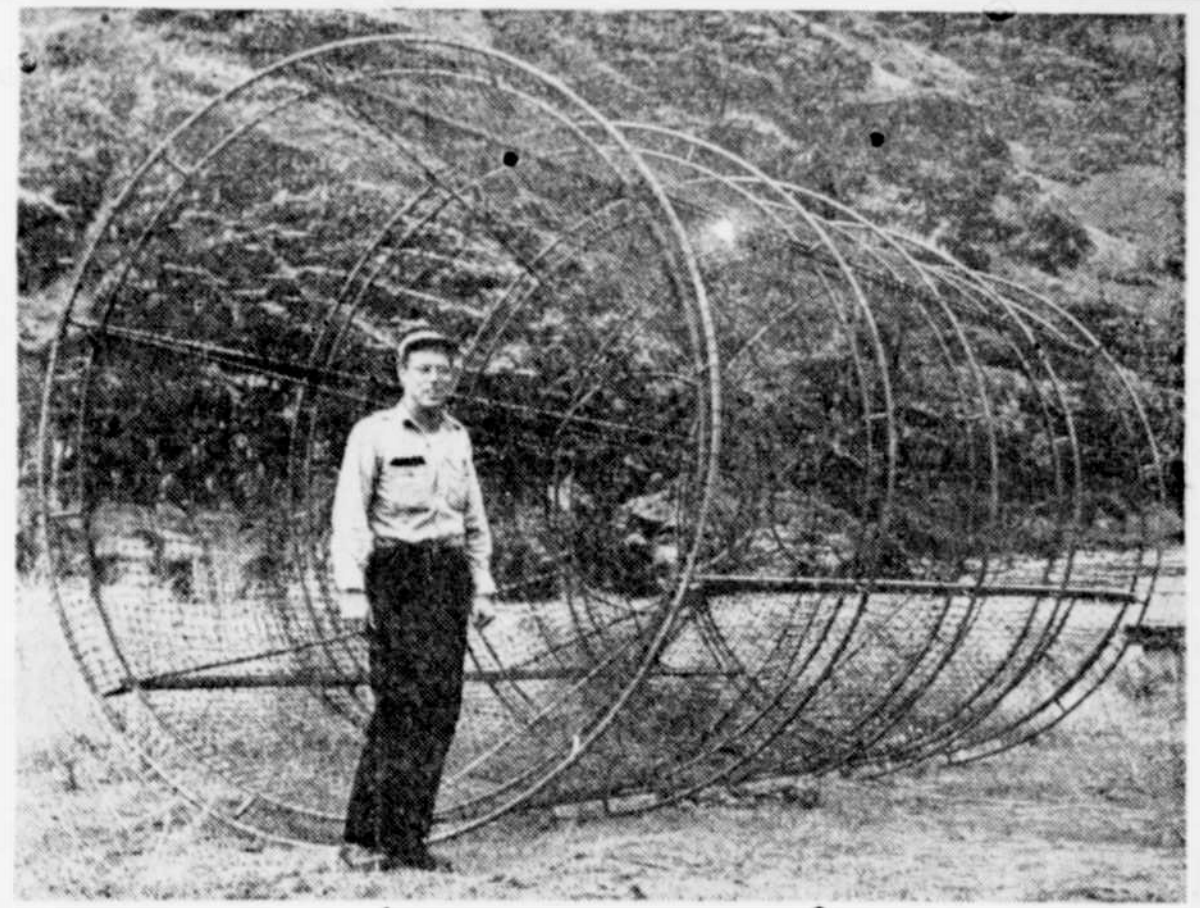
Fish-Wild Life Study Planned By Idaho Power

Fish, fowl and other wildlife of the middle reach of the Snake river are to become subjects of a three-year conservation study.

The Federal Power commission has authorized the Idaho Power company to make available to the Department of the Interior's Fish and Wildlife service up to \$250,000 for conducting this extensive survey.

Personnel of the Idaho and Oregon Fish and Game commissions and of the Federal Fish and Wildlife service will make the survey to determine what permanent conservation measures are necessary on the stretch of the Snake river affected by the Brownlee, Oxbow and Hells canyon hydroelectric developments.

The project will be started immediately. The wildlife agencies will conduct studies of streams and waters in the area and survey the numbers and time of migration of anadromous species through this reach of the river. They will study the feasibility of fish passage, hatcheries, relocation of anadromous fish runs, and other methods to protect this resource. In addition, they will study the resident game fish and wildlife opportunities brought about by the construction of these projects. All of these studies will

other wildlife survey of this part of the river. At the Brownlee and other hydroelectric developments, Idaho Power will protect anadromous fish during construction period by transporting them around construction areas.
