Mr. Lake was stricken at his home, was being brought to the hospital by his wife, a son and a daughter when their car ran out of gas near the home of a neighbor Joe Fenwick. The trip for medical aid was continued in Fenwick's car.

Mr. Lake died at 3:25 p.m. shortly after crossing the Snake river bridge at Marsing. He was born Sept. 9, 1895 at San Jose, Calif. He was reared in Birchville, Calif., and moved to Sheaville, Ore. five years ago. He was a veteran of World War I and a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He had served two years overseas as a navy blacksmith. Since moving to Jordan he worked at gunsmith and blacksmith work at his home.
