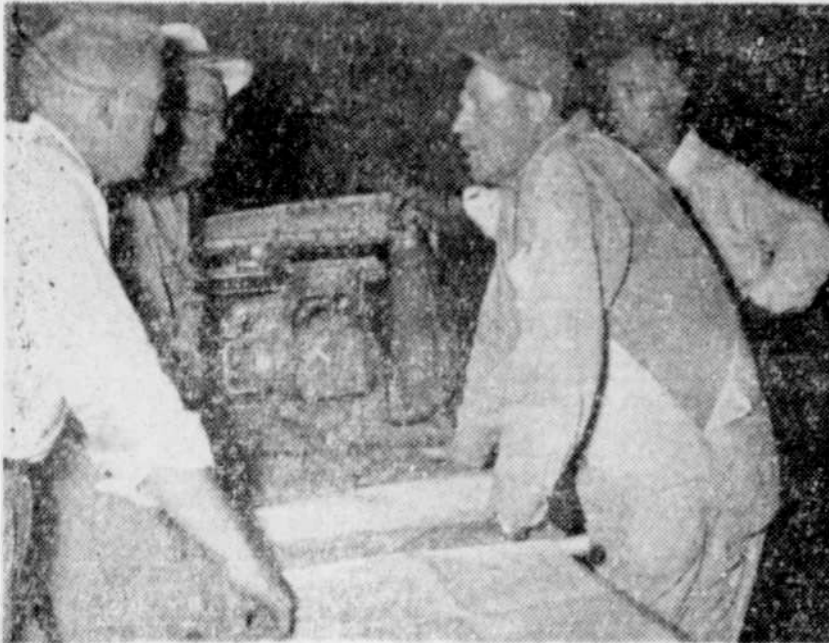


**Eagles Racing Against Time**
