State Corn Show at Ontario Ready For Opening; 30 Local Entrants

The best of Oregon's corn is expected at the 15th annual Oregon state corn show to be held in Ontario Friday and Saturday, according to Leeds Bailey, county extension agent. The show will be held at the Veterans Memorial hall.

The schedule of events calls for the show's doors to open at 10:00 a. m. on Friday. Samples from the yield contest's ten ear exhibits and commercial exhibits will be on display. The Ontario Chamber of Commerce and Kiwanis clubs will serve coffee and doughnuts during the show.

On Saturday the show will open at 9:30 a. m. with 4-H and adult corn judging to start at 10:30. The FFA judging contest will be held at 11:00.

An awards program for prize winners will be held at 1:30 Saturday.

Bailey reported more than usual interest in the show, with 30 local entrants in the yield contest. Ten ear exhibits are due at the county extension office by Thursday noon. Winners and other entries from several county shows held in western Oregon will arrive on Thursday.
