MRS. B. MORFITT RECOVERS FROM MAJOR SURGERY

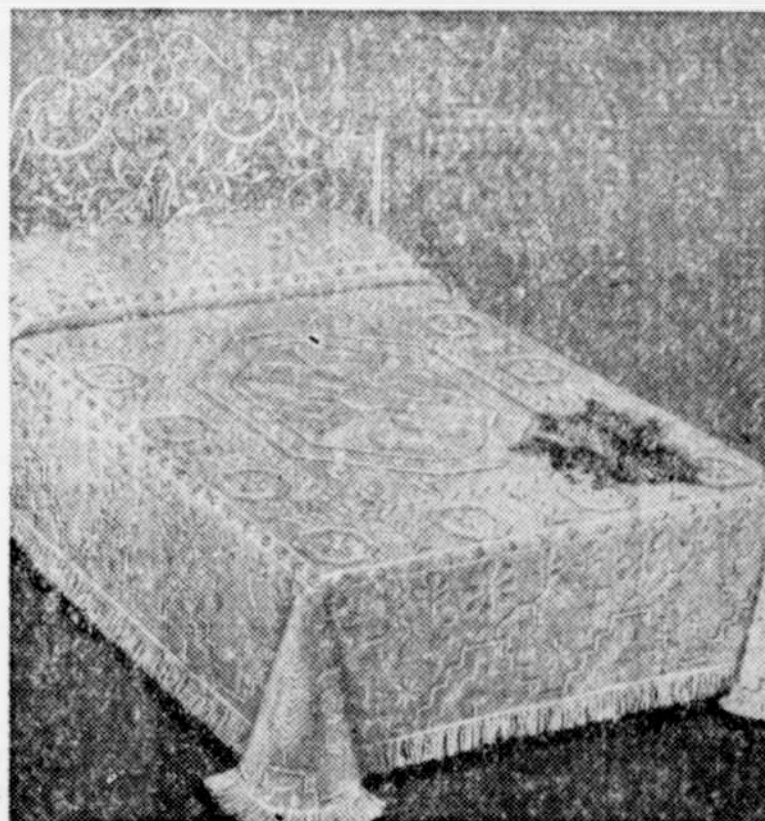
Mrs. Bob Morfitt of the Owyhee Dam is reported as doing fine after undergoing major surgery at the Malheur Memorial hospital Friday.
