

Youths Fined For Post Damage

Fines of \$100 each were levied against two Adrian and one Nyssa youth and another Adrian youth was assessed \$50 fine in Don M. Graham's justice court Friday after they were cited by state police for damaging highway sign posts.

The arrests were the result of alleged damage to signposts, newspaper boxes and mail boxes several months ago when the "loot" was scattered over a wide area.

Those fined were James R. Webster, 17, \$50, and Harold R. Matthews, 22; Robert L. Neeley, 20, and Marvin G. Richards, 19, \$100 each. Webster's fine was reduced on the basis of testimony that he remained in the car while the other three did the damage, Judge Graham said.

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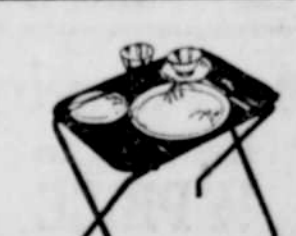


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
