Officers Installed At Sunshine Meeting

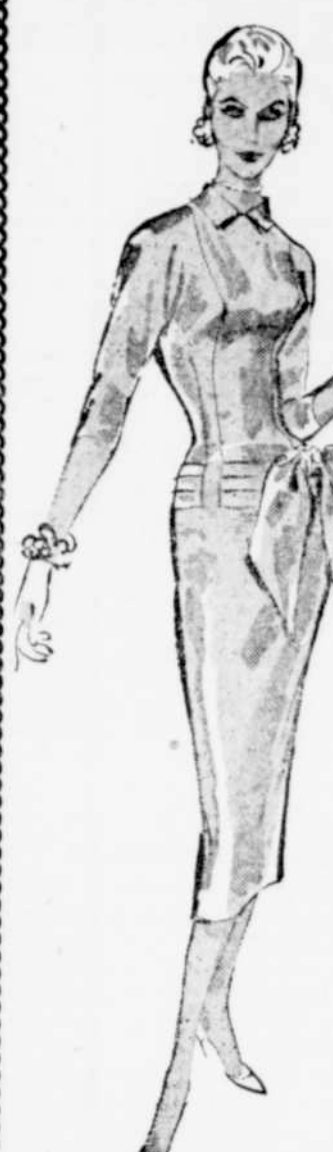
The Yellow Rose Rebekah Sunshine club met at the IOOF hall Friday afternoon for the first meeting of the year.
