

Nyssa Upsets Favored Fives In League Tilts

The Nyssa Bulldogs ran away from Weiser Friday night and caught Emmett Saturday night to post two important SRV league victories.

Friday night the Bulldogs raced to a 50-30 upset win over Weiser—a team that had lost but one game to Ontario. The deadly corner shooting of Larry Schenk who scored 21 points was more than enough to apply the clincher. The locals held a 22-14 halftime lead and blew the game wide open in the third quarter.

Weiser was not as poor a team as the score would indicate. Time after time fast-break attack patterns looked good only to have the ball miss the hoop. In contrast, most of the Bulldog baskets were swishers.

Saturday night it looked like an easy Emmett victory. They held a 23-16 half advantage and looked good doing it. The Bulldogs began pecking away in the second half and with two minutes to play trailed by only one point. Doug Lewis hit two free throws to put the Nyssamen ahead 44-43 and Forbess, who was high point man with 16, nailed down the win with a final basket for an important 46-43 triumph.

The Bulldogs travel to Meridian Friday, returning Saturday to meet Payette on the local floor.
