#### 15 Years Ago—April 30, 1942

Roscoe Kellogg, Nyssa, has purchased the Gate City Dairy from Herbert Fisher. . . . Approximately 400 men between the ages of 45 and 65 registered in Nyssa last week under the selective service program. . . . Ross C. Corn, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Corn, has enlisted in the army. . . . 2732 women in Malheur county registered voluntarily for mobilization of women for occupational classification.

#### 20 Years Ago—April 29, 1937

Fred Osterkamp, governor of Nyssa Legion post, accepted a citation in behalf of the post for membership and fulfilling all requirements at a special meeting held in Ontario. The award was made by State Commander Guy Cordon of Roseburg. . . . Grace Kygar of Owyhee won second in the finals in county spelling contests last week in Vale. . . . Preliminary steps were taken by the County Boundary Board at a meeting in Vale for permission to build a high school in Adrian.

#### 30 Years Ago—April 29, 1927

Work started this week on the new blacksmith shop on Main street which is being erected by Frank Leuk. . . . Mrs. Addie Wilson was surprised by 40 friends at her home Monday evening. Dr. and Mrs. J. R. Cundall and Linda returned Saturday from a week's vacation trip into Washington.

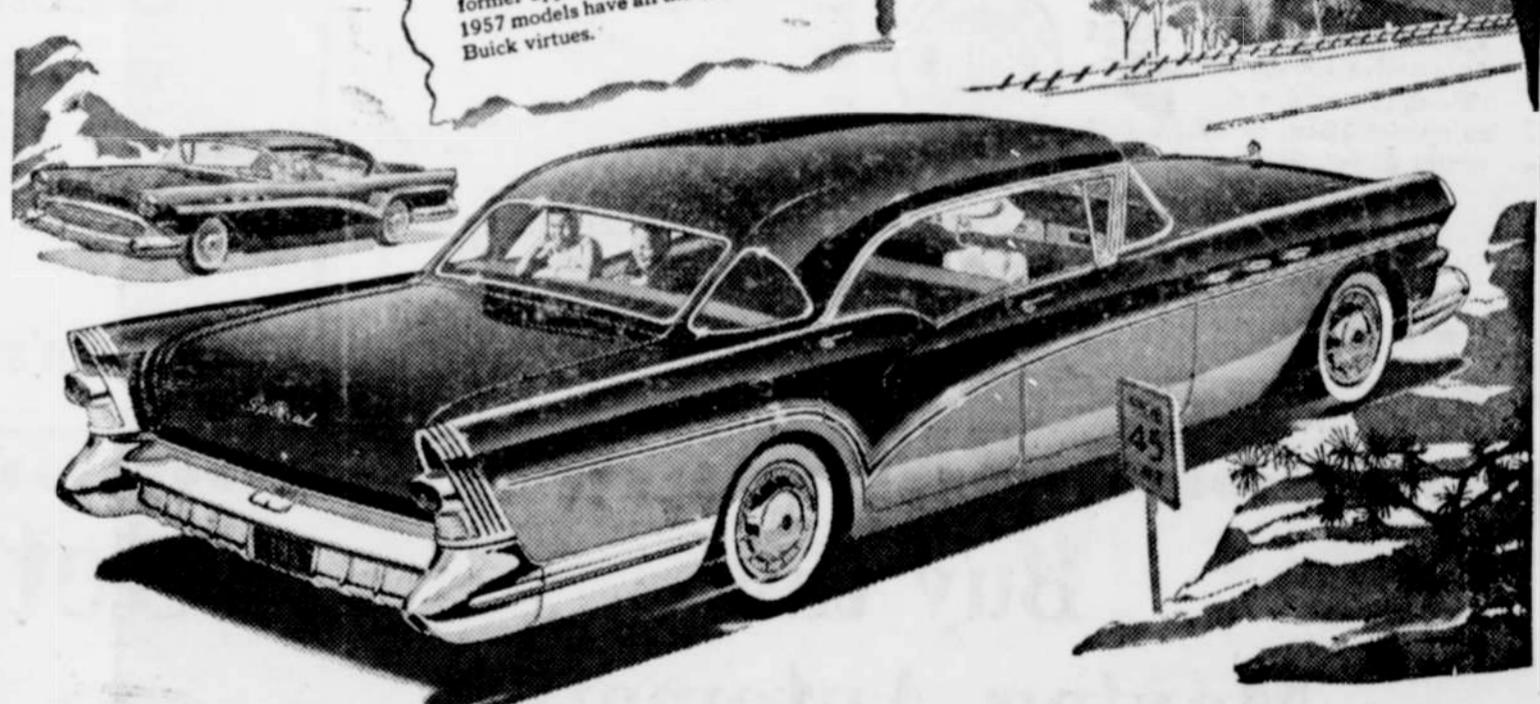
