Free-for-All, "Family Fight" Involve Police

Seven men were cited Monday for disorderly conduct charges after what police described as a free-for-all brawl near the El Sombrero cafe on East Main street. Six of them were released on \$35 bail each and all failed to appear in court for arraignment. The seventh, Salvador G. Michel, after being given emergency treatment at Malheur Memorial hospital, was confined until Tuesday when he pleaded guilty to the charges and paid a \$35 fine.

Those cited and forfeiting bail were Pedro L. Aleman, Juan U. Lopez, Fortunato G. Galindo, Luis A. Villanueva and Raul Narbaiz. Galindo was given emergency treatment at the hospital and was released.

On a complaint signed by Christine Stinett charging assault and battery, Clarence Clifton was arrested Saturday by city police and turned over to the justice court where he was fined \$50 and given a 90-day jail sentence. The fine was paid and the jail sentence was suspended. Clifton was originally charged with threatening to commit a felony and the charge was later reduced.

Louis G. Garcia is in the city jail, awaiting transfer to the county jail after he was found guilty of larceny in the justice court. Garcia allegedly stole a pocket book containing \$20 from the pocket of Fred McCarty in a local tavern and Garcia was chased by a bystander, who witnessed the incident, to another tavern, according to Justice of Peace Don M. Graham. Garcia was fined \$50 and sentenced to 30 days in jail.
