

## Bulldog Basketball Squad Down to 12; First Games with Burns in Local Gym

The Bulldog basketball squad began taking shape this week in preparation for the first games of the season Dec. 6 and 7 with Burns here in Nyssa's gymnasium.

Coach Stan Olson reports that early season turnouts had been thinned down to 13 varsity players and 15 boys on the junior varsity squad early this week. One more varsity player will be lost today when Clark Jaques has a thumb operation as a result of a football injury. He is expected to be out of play from six to 12 weeks.

Nyssa's frosh-soph team try-outs are still being held with 26 boys out for this team play.

### Four Lettermen on Squad

Four basketball lettermen, Seniors Gale Coleman, John Messick, Larry Roberts and Jim Bergam, are on Olson's present 12-man varsity squad, along with three other seniors, Monte Burbank, Chuck Rieb and Lloyd Montoya. Also included are Juniors Daryle Duffin, Gary Toomb, Ron Rootstock and Dave Sewright and Sophomore Jack Meyers.

Coach Olson plans to keep the varsity at the strength of 10 to 13 men, pointing out that with three teams this year he can bring up promising junior varsity players or send varsity players down to the JV squad.

### Material Looks Good

Explaining that it is still too early to give a starting lineup or tell just how good this year's squad will be, Olson did say that "real good material" is out for the team this year and that "early practices have not been discouraging."
