Nyssa Youngsters Complete Project

One hundred and twenty-five youngsters attending school in Nyssa were among about 500 in Malheur county who successfully completed the summer reading project sponsored by the Malheur county library in 1957.

Many of these boys and girls borrowed books through the Nyssa public library, which in turn had borrowed approximately 200 additional children's books from the county library for the summer. A number of them borrowed books from the station wagon bookmobile and several directly from the county library itself.

The county-wide distribution was as follows: bookmobile 132, county library (direct) 179, mail service (from county library) between 60 and 70, Nyssa library 101 and Vale library 27.

Among those receiving awards from the reading project were 35 at Adrian grade school, 18 at Harper, 13 at Jordan Valley, 7 at Juntura, 6 at Ironside and 14 at Willowcreek. Boys and girls at points farthest from the library received their books by mail.

State Suspends Drivers' Licenses

The department of motor vehicles today released names of 284 drivers including four from Malheur county, whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning Nov. 12 and ending Nov. 15.

Length of suspension varies depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department or requirements of Oregon law. The department said some of the licenses involving financial responsibility and court recommendations may have been reinstated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that an arrest for driving while suspended may lead to a jail sentence and fine and must result in an additional period of suspension. Those suspended in Malheur county were:

Driving While Suspended Includes any conviction for violation of traffic laws, involving operation of motor vehicle, while driving privileges were under suspension.

Dean S. Taylor, Ontario, excessive motor noise, suspended 11/5/57, 1 year.

Driving While Intoxicated Mandatory suspension, Trinidad Garcia, Vale, suspended 10/7/57, 90 days. Gilberto Resendez, 29, Ontario, suspended 9/8/57, one year.

Financial Responsibility Failure to show proof of financial responsibility, Wilmer Dale Rhinehart, 26, Ontario, suspended 11/14/57.
