Judd and Eugene Stephen.

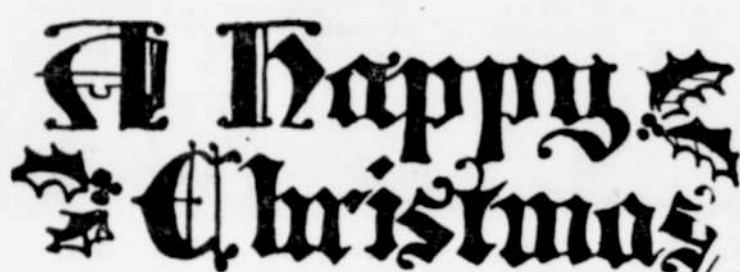
