Edward Julius Steinke died suddenly at his home on the evening of Dec. 11, 1957. He was born Jan. 1, 1890, at Lincoln, Neb., to Mr. and Mrs. John Steinke.

Mr. Steinke was baptized and confirmed in the Evangelical Lutheran church while living in Nebraska. He spent his early life in that state and on May 5, 1920, was united in marriage to Verda Hasty at Nelson, Neb.

Owyhee Engineer Passes in Calif. Following Stroke

Frank A. Banks, 74, of Coulee Dam, Wash., who served as construction superintendent of the Owyhee dam, died Saturday at Los Angeles following a stroke.

After the Owyhee was completed, Mr. Banks was named project engineer in 1933 for construction of the giant Grand Coulee dam in Washington and he remained as supervisor of its operations until retiring in 1950. He was also construction engineer on dams at Jackson Lakes, Wyo.; Arrowrock, above Boise; American Falls, Ida., and Peace Valley in Oregon.

At the time he supervised the Owyhee it was considered one of the highest dams in the world and the greatest reclamation project completed by the government, Nyssa old-timers reported.

Mr. Banks is survived by his wife; a son, John Banks, San Marino, Calif.; and a daughter, Mrs. Stephen Girard, Toledo, O.
