Three Sentences, Paroles Result From Break-In

Three Adrian teenagers were sentenced to the MacLaren school for boys in Woodburn Friday by County Juvenile Judge G. Y. Chester, as a result of the March 23 break-in of the Adrian theater.

Five other 15 and 16-year-old youths involved in the March 23 break-in were paroled to their parents by Judge Chester.

The juvenile judge ordered Fred Ray Dardin, 15, Melvin Oscar Haney, 16, and Donald Clayton Reed, 15, to the MacLaren school. All three had been charged with "maliciously, wantonly and feloniously injuring and destroying personal property of another . . . dismantling and wrecking moving picture projectors, screen and film."

The three youths had previously appeared before Judge Chester Feb. 3, charged with breaking and entering the Adrian school. Haney was also charged with larceny of a camera at that time.

Complaints charging six of the youths with injuring personal property and two with "breaking the glass of the Adrian theater" were signed by Ray Holly of Nyssa, owner of the theater which has been closed for several months.

Holly said previously that between \$2000 and \$3000 worth of property had been destroyed and stolen in the break-in.

Notice of Special Assessment Street and Alley Improvement District No. 5

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to Ordinance No. 379 passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, on the 17th day of April, 1958, there has been levied and assessed against the property in Street & Alley Improvement District No. 5 for the improvement of streets and alleys in said Street & Alley Improvement District No. 5 the sums and amounts hereinafter set forth. Said assessments have been made, as directed by said Ordinance, and entered on the records in the City Lien Docket, and the same are now due and must be paid on or before the 28th day of April, 1958, unless written application is filed with the City Recorder of the City of Nyssa, within ten days of the date hereof, to pay said assessments in installments. That said assessments are a lien against the following described real property in the amounts set forth against each thereof.

In the event the sum assessed against any lot or parcel thereof is not wholly paid to the City Recorder of the City of Nyssa or application filed with said City Recorder for the payment of said assessments in installments, as provided by the laws of the State of Oregon, said sum or amount so assessed against any said lots or parcels respectively shall be deemed delinquent and the Council may, at any time thereafter, enforce the collection thereof by foreclosure in the manner provided in the Charter and Ordinances of said City of Nyssa and the statutes of the State of Oregon.

BE IT REMEMBERED, that pursuant to Ordinance No. 376, adopted by the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, on the 29th day of October, 1957, as amended by Ordinance No. 378, adopted by said City Council on the 10th day of December, 1957, providing for the improvement of certain streets and alleys in the City of Nyssa, to-wit:

STREETS
North Eighth Street, from the south line of Park Avenue to its intersection with North Main Street; North Seventh Street, from the south line of Park Avenue to the north line of Bower Avenue; North Sixth Street, from the south line of Walnut Avenue to the north line of Park Avenue and from the south line of Park Avenue to the south line of Emison Avenue; South Sixth Street, from the south line of Good Avenue to the north line of Reece Avenue and from the north line of Ennis Avenue to the north line of King Avenue; North Fifth Street, from the south line of Locust Avenue to the north line of Park Avenue and from the south line of Park Avenue to the south line of Emison Avenue; North Fourth Street, from the south line of Locust Avenue to the south line of Walnut Avenue; North Second Street, from the south line of Chestnut Avenue to the south line of Beech Avenue; South Second Street, from the south line of Good Avenue to the north line of King Avenue; East Second Street, from the south line of East Elmgrove Avenue to the north line of East Main St.; Beech Avenue, from the west line of North First St. to the east line of North Third Street; Walnut Avenue, from the east boundary line of the alley extended south, in Block 69 of Green Addition to the east line of North Third Street; Maple Avenue, from the west line of North Third Street to the east line of North Sixth Street; Green Avenue, from a line approximately ten feet east of the western boundary of Lot 4 of Block 61 of Green Addition, extended north, to the east line of North Second Street; Emison Avenue, from the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way to the east line of North Third Street and from the west line of North Fourth Street to the east line of North Main Street; Elmgrove Avenue, from the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way to the east line of North Sixth Street to the east line of North Main Street; Reece Avenue, from the west line of North Main Street to the east line of North Fourth Street; Ennis Avenue, from the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way to the east line of South First Street to the east line of South Sixth Street; King Avenue, from the west line of the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way to the east line of South First Street exclusive of the intersections contained within the above described streets and avenues which intersections shall not be included for purposes of assessment against the properties to be benefited under the improvement district herein created.

ALLEYS
Between Main Street and Good Avenue, from the west line of the Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way to the west line of South Sixth Street, exclusive of all intervening street crossings; between Main Street and Bower Avenue, from the west line of North First Street to the east line of North Sixth Street, exclusive of all intervening street crossings.

After the expiration of the time for filing protests and remonstrances against the improvement of said streets and alleys set for the 15th day of November, 1957, at 3:00 P. M. of said day, the City Manager of said City of Nyssa proceeded to and did ascertain as nearly as possible the cost of the improvement of said streets and alleys according to the estimates of the City's Engineer who was directed by the City Council to prepare and submit such estimate, and he did apportion and assess the sum against each lot or parcel of land thereto and included in said Street & Alley Improvement District as determined and established by said Ordinance, and the following list or record containing the name of each land owner in said District according to the records of Malheur County, Oregon, and the description of each piece of property and the total cost of such improvement is hereby submitted as and for the assessment roll for said improvement, to-wit:
