The two winners in the senior division, Joy and Charles, will receive scholarships to 4-H summer school at OSC, June 16 to 22. Donors of these scholarships is the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health Association.

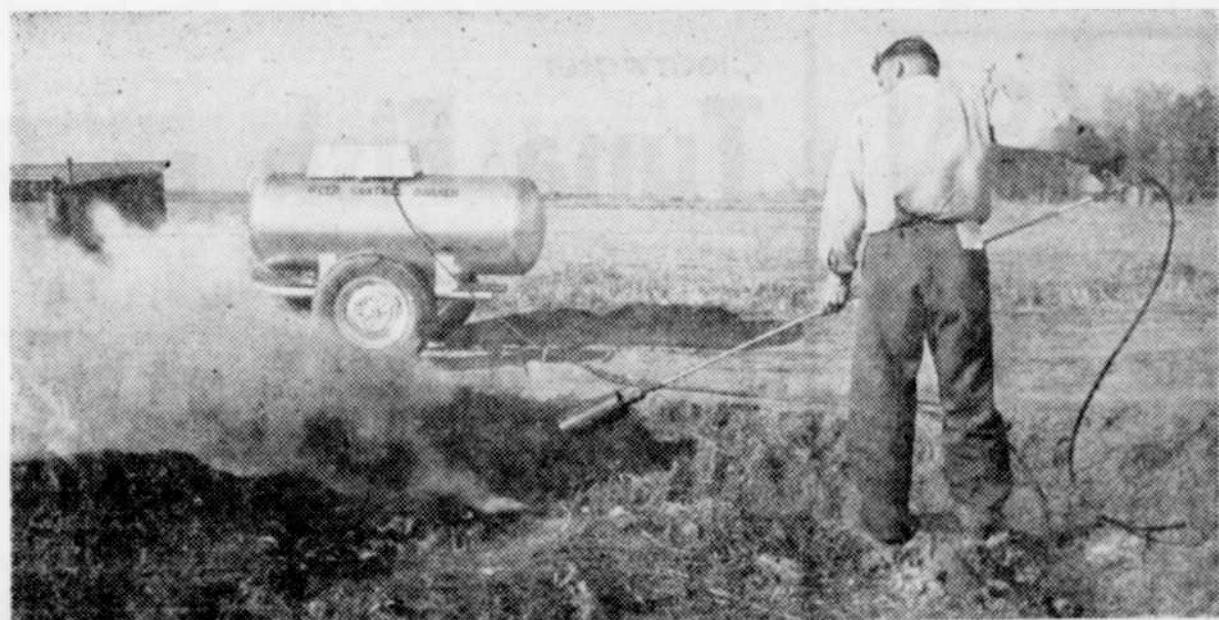
