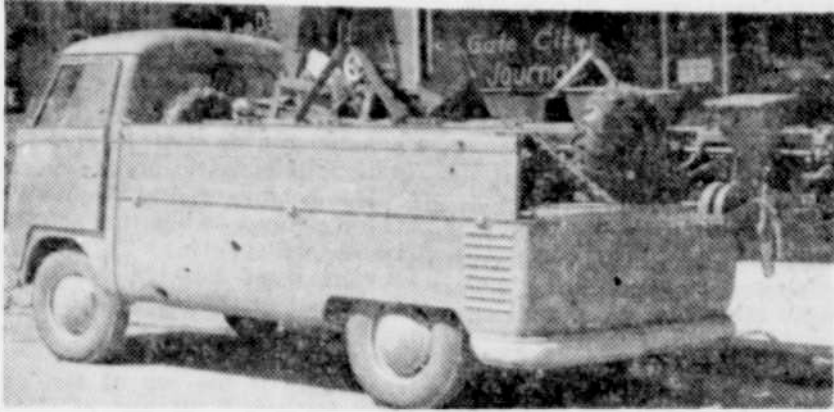


Nyssa Product Goes to Market
