Council Sees \$162,302 Proposed Budget

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by the proposed budget include \$800 for police car, \$500 for a furnace, \$2,000 water fund equipment reserve and \$1,000 street fund equipment reserve.

Replacements Limited

Some \$7,476 has been proposed for water line replacement, extension and system maintenance and only \$440 for the same type of sewer work. The proposed budget includes outlays for little more than personal service, regular maintenance and operation and debt retirement.

Tax base for the 1958-59 budget, within the six percent limitation, is \$29,179.

In addition to council members, Nyssa's budget committee includes hold-over members, Dick Forbess, Paul Penrod, Chuck Landreth and Gene Grasty. The council also appointed Dr. K. A. Danford, Ira C. Sage, Bert Lienkaemper and Glen McGinnis (all alternate) Wednesday night to fill out the committee.

Tonight's meeting will be open to the public.
