

Nyssa Beetmen Slaughter Grandview 20 to 0 Tuesday in First Border League Game of Season Here

Nyssa's Beetmen started off their Border league play Tuesday night here in town with an impressive 23 to 0 win over Grandview, taking the edge off Friday's non-league loss of 4-3 to the Mt. Home Air Force nine.

Tuesday night just about every man on the Nyssa squad racked up at least one hit as they pounded out a total of 22 and committed no errors. On the other hand, Grandview managed to eke out only two hits, both off pitcher Roy Barnes who pitched the first six innings, while they made four errors.

Frank Bishop relieved Barnes, who received credit for the win, in the seventh inning and shut the hapless Grandview team out. Larry Bates led the Beetmen hitting with three for three. Jack Bowen hit three for five, as did Larry Schenk who included a triple and a double in his. Ronni Bates also hit three from his six times at bat.

Friday night the Beetmen managed to tie Mt. Home's six hits in their first practice game of the season, but they could get in only three runs to the Air Force's four. Nyssa committed two errors while Mt. Home made only one. Roy Barnes was charged with the loss and Bob Doder received credit for the win.

The Beetmen went against Weiser last night in their second non-league game. They return to league play, however, when they meet Nampa there Friday night and Payette there next Tuesday night.
