NOTICE OF VACATION OF ALLEYS AND AVENUE

Notice is hereby given that on the 21st day of July, 1958 the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, at a special session duly held on said date, adopted Resolutions No. 213 and 215 instituting proceedings to vacate a portion of Maple Avenue between 6th and 7th Streets, in Park Addition and a certain alley in Block 19 of Teutsch Addition, respectively, both additions being in the City of Nyssa and thereafter on the 12th day of August, 1958, said City Council at a regular session duly held on said date, adopted Resolution No. 214 instituting proceedings to vacate a portion of a certain alley in Block 33 of Park Addition to the City of Nyssa, all of which portions of Avenue and alleys are more particularly described as follows to wit:

UNDER RESOLUTION NO. 213: All that portion of Maple Avenue between 6th and 7th Streets in the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon excepting that portion of said Maple Avenue bounded and described as follows: beginning at the Northeast corner of Lot 20 in Block 33 of Park Addition to the City of Nyssa; thence running due North 72 feet to the Southeast corner of Lot 10 in Block 40 of said Park Addition; thence running due East 18 feet to the Southwest corner of Lot 9 in said Block 40 of said Park Addition; thence running due South 72 feet to the Northwest corner of Lot 1 in said Block 33 of said Park Addition; thence running due West 18 feet to the point of beginning.

Reserving at all times in and to the City of Nyssa an easement and right-of-way over, across and under said above described avenue, for the purpose of installing, maintaining, replacing and otherwise operating sewers and any or all public utilities or city facilities;

UNDER RESOLUTION NO. 215: All that certain alley running East and West through Block 19 of Teutsch Addition to the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon.

Reserving at all times in and to the City of Nyssa an easement and right-of-way over, across and under said above described avenue, for the purpose of installing, maintaining, replacing and otherwise operating sewers and any or all public utilities or city facilities;

UNDER RESOLUTION NO. 214: All that portion of the alley running East and West through Block 33 of Park Addition to the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, bounded and described as follows: beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 16 in said Block 33; thence running West 120 feet to the East boundary line of 7th Street; thence running South 15 feet to the Northwest Corner of Lot 15 in said Block 33; thence running East along the North boundary lines of Lots 15 to 12 and the West 16.8 feet of Lot 11, all inclusive, a distance of 120 feet; thence due North to the place of beginning. Reserving at all times in and to the City of Nyssa an easement and right-of-way over, across and under the North 6 feet of said above described portion of said alley, for the purpose of installing, maintaining, replacing and otherwise operating sewers and any or all public utilities or city facilities;
