

Extensive Search Uncovered Bodies Of River Victims

The bodies of the two youthful Ontario river victims who drowned last Wednesday afternoon have been found. The boys were reported missing at about 7:00 p.m., only minutes after the bodies of two Boise men were recovered from the Snake river near the Nyssa bridge where they drowned earlier in the afternoon.

Six-year-old Charles Leon Thomas, the first boy found, was discovered Friday on a rock guard by an irrigation pump on an island farmed by George Nishimura. His companion, Marty Nailon, 7, was found by Walter Flynn and Jim Smith, both of Ontario, four miles downstream from the Weiser bridge near Hart's dairy farm.

Speed Porter and Ray Harmon, both of Nyssa, were among the skin divers who assisted in the search. They dived for four hours Wednesday and 13 hours Thursday after spending two hours Wednesday searching for the bodies of the Boise men, Gerald Zimmerman and Earl Allen.

Services for Marty were held Sunday at 4 p.m. at Evergreen cemetery in Ontario. The lad, who was a former Nyssa resident, moved to Ontario with his family
