The Bulldog's new football coach, Bob Morford, is not scheduled to report for duty until Friday, Jenkins said, but will be here for uniform issuance Friday.

This will be Morford's first year as Bulldog head football coach. He was hired last May to end of the school year by the end of he school year by the resignation of Stan Olson.

He has been the Notus high school football coach for the past four years where, as one of the

most successful coaches in the Snake river valley B league, his teams ran up a 8 won, five lost and one tied record.

Here at Nyssa Morford will serve as head football and baseball coach, assist in basketball, and teach boys' health, physical education and general science.

Coach Harry McGinley will assist Morford with football and baseball and serve as head basketball coach.
