### County Livestock Annual Meeting Set Sept. 19-20

The date for the annual meeting of the Malheur county Livestock association was set as Sept. 19 and 20 during the association beef barbecue picnic held at the Vale city Park Sunday, according to George W. Bain, secretary.

The change in date from November which has been the usual time for the meeting was made so county proposals could be presented at the state Cattleman's association meeting in Redmond Oct. 31, Nov. 1 and 2. The meeting will be in Ontario this year.

The formation of a feeder committee in the state Cattleman's association was explained by George Russell, state president. Russell explained that the great increase in cattle feeding in the Western states and particularly in Oregon created a need for organized effort on the part of the livestock feeders. In some states there are feeder associations but since many problems facing feeders are the same as those affecting producers, the state association voted to form a committee composed of feeders to be affiliated and a part of the present association. Such things as promotion of Western fed beef, beef grading, freight rates, constant supplies, etc. are now facing the feeders and pro-
