

"Attend School" Law Enforcement To Be Observed

More rigid enforcement of Oregon's compulsory school attendance law will be in effect this year, it was announced jointly this week by County School Supt. William E. Leggett and Juvenile Officer Robert Kriner, both of Vale.

With certain exceptions provided by the law, all children between the ages of 7 and 18 are required to attend, during the entire school term, a public, full-time school of the district in which the child resides, the public was reminded. The responsibility rests with every person having control of any child in that age group.

Exceptions from the law include legally employed children between the ages of 16 and 18 years who are attending a public, part-time school not less than 5 hours per week or 180 hours a year; those attending private or parochial schools having such branches as are usually taught in public school; children proving to the school board they have acquired sufficient knowledge in ordinary branches of learning taught in public school; abnormal, subnormal or physically handicapped who have a physician's certificate.

Children between 7 and 10 years, whose parents live more than one and one half miles, and children over 10 years living more than three miles from some public school which does not provide transportation, are exempt.

Parents or private teachers, with written permission from the county school superintendent in cases of necessity, may instruct

The attendance supervisor, who in Malheur county is Kriner, has the responsibility of determining whether parents or other responsible persons have failed to comply with the law.

The county superintendent reminded all persons that all schools in Malheur county start Tuesday, Sept. 2, the day after Labor day.

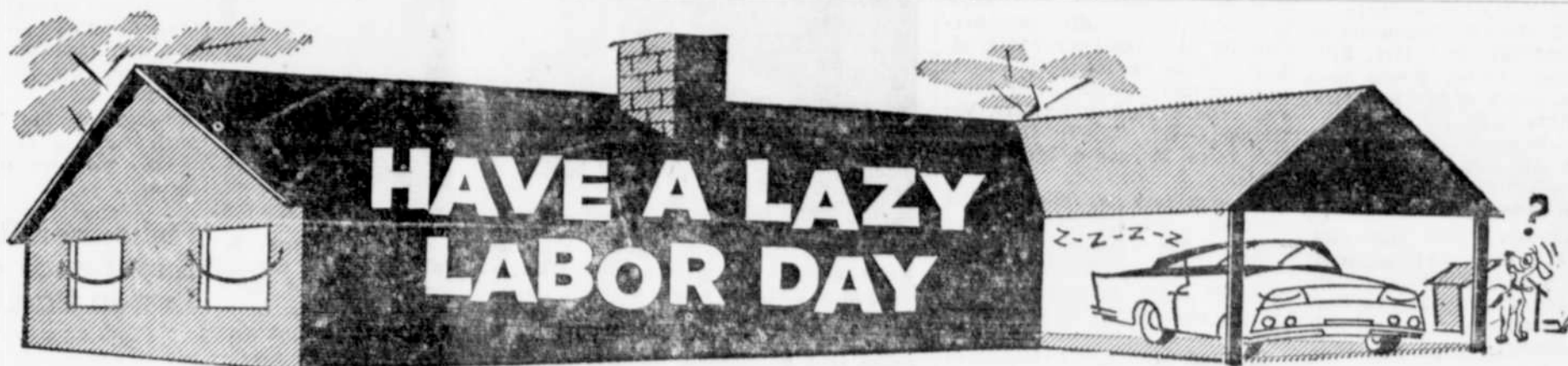
James Yost Assists At Moro Branch Bank
