Spud Committee Rejects USDA Diversion Rule

The Eastern Oregon and Idaho Potato committee rejected the U.S.D.A. potato diversion program requirements for an 8 ounce minimum for number 2 spuds at a Friday meeting in Pocatello, even though it was reported that government diversion payments could not be obtained on any other basis.

The Friday meeting was called, as a follow-up to a meeting earlier in the week, for the purpose of considering marketing regulations to apply on the late potato crop. Industry opposition to the 8 ounce No. 2 requirement was so pronounced, the committee said, they felt it unwise to establish that type of regulation.

A change in shipping requirements was recommended, however, on the basis of the reported large surplus of potatoes throughout the United States, and there was no opposition expressed to the U.S.D.A. regulation limiting the U.S. No. 1 grade to a two inch or four ounce minimum.

The committee voted to require the Russet potatoes to meet the following minimums: All potatoes must be a U.S. No. 2 or better grade, two inch or four ounce minimum, provided that external grade defects cannot exceed a five percent tolerance and that under-size cannot exceed a two percent tolerance.

"This regulation was approved," the committee stated, "in order to give area shippers more freedom in meeting competition, especially that of the packager, and to tighten up tolerances to assure housewives a better appearing package with fewer off-grade potatoes in it."

The committee estimated this action would hold about the same amount of lower grade potatoes from the market as the eight ounce No. 2 requirement, but would enable a better marketing job to be accomplished than otherwise.

The committee said this regulation would apply to Malheur county and to eastern and southern Idaho and will probably be made effective Nov. 5.
