

Thirteen Oregon State Measures, Constitutional Changes to Appear On Tuesday's Election Ballots

Voters in Malheur county, along with those throughout the state, will find 13 state measures on Tuesday's general election ballots.

MEASURE NO. 1 is a proposed constitutional amendment fixing state boundaries, repealing obsolete constitutional provisions describing state boundaries and authorizing their modification by interstate agreement with the approval of Congress. This measure, if passed, would clarify present "middle channel" descriptions of Oregon's boundaries bordered by the Columbia and Snake rivers.

MEASURE NO. 2, also a constitutional amendment, proposed to increase state funds for War Veteran's loans. Specifically, it

would increase from four percent to six percent the assessed valuation maximum limitation on all property in the state on the amount of state bonds that may be issued to raise funds to make farm and home loans to World War II and Korean War veterans. This would increase the total authorized borrowing credit of the state from approximately \$150,000,000 for farm and home loans to veterans to approximately \$225,000,000 with interest on the additional \$75,000,000 estimated at about \$2,500,000 per annum.

MEASURE NO. 3, another constitutional amendment, would increase the salaries of state legislators from \$600 to \$1200 per year. It is estimated that this amendment would increase the aggregate salaries of the 90 members of the legislature by \$54,800 per annum.

MEASURE NO. 4, would eliminate the present provision for the death penalty for first degree murder, unless recommended otherwise by the jury, from the Oregon constitution and give the Legislature the power to fix the penalty.

MEASURE NO. 5, amending the constitution and headed "Financing Urban Redevelopment Projects", would make possible the use of any increase in property taxes, as a result of an increase in assessed valuation because of an urban renewal project, to pay any indebtedness incurred in carrying out the project.

MEASURE NO. 6 would modify the county debt limitation by constitutional amendment, authorizing the legislature to fix maximum limitation on a county's bonded indebtedness incurred in carrying out purposes prescribed by law. Under the present law, counties in effect, are prohibited from issuing bonds for any purpose other than road construction. This amendment would remove this restriction and allow the voters to authorize county bonds subject to the limitations set forth by the legislature.

MEASURE NO. 7, a constitutional amendment, would authorize the legislature to enact laws permitting the calling of a special grand jury to handle special matters and investigations in addition to the regular grand jury to handle regular cases.

MEASURE NO. 8, another constitutional amendment, would authorize the legislature to alter, reduce, enlarge or terminate the use or purpose of any state institution located outside Marion county any time after 10 years from the date of the election which located the institution.

MEASURE NO. 9 would amend the constitution to authorize the state supreme court to appoint temporary judges to the supreme court and the lower courts to assign lower court judges to serve temporarily outside of the district for which they were elected.

MEASURE NO. 10 would empower the state of Oregon, by constitutional amendment, to acquire and develop water, thermal and nuclear power generating facilities and develop electrical energy for transmission and sale on a wholesale basis or directly to industries using 10,000 kilowatts or more. The state power commission's authority to issue general obligation bonds would be increased from 6 percent of the state's total assessed valuation to 10 percent of the total.

MEASURE NO. 11, a constitutional amendment, would authorize the voters in any county to adopt a charter to provide for the exercise of authority over matters of county concern. Initiative and referendum powers would also be reserved to the legal voters of counties adopting a charter.

MEASURE NO. 12 would permit the Board of Control to discontinue using the Eastern Oregon Tuberculosis hospital at The Dalles and the University State Tuberculosis hospital in Portland in whole or in part, giving them the power to designate the use of these state facilities.

MEASURE NO. 13 would amend the constitution to permit employees or members of a school board, including teachers, of the Board of Higher Education to serve as members of the legislature.

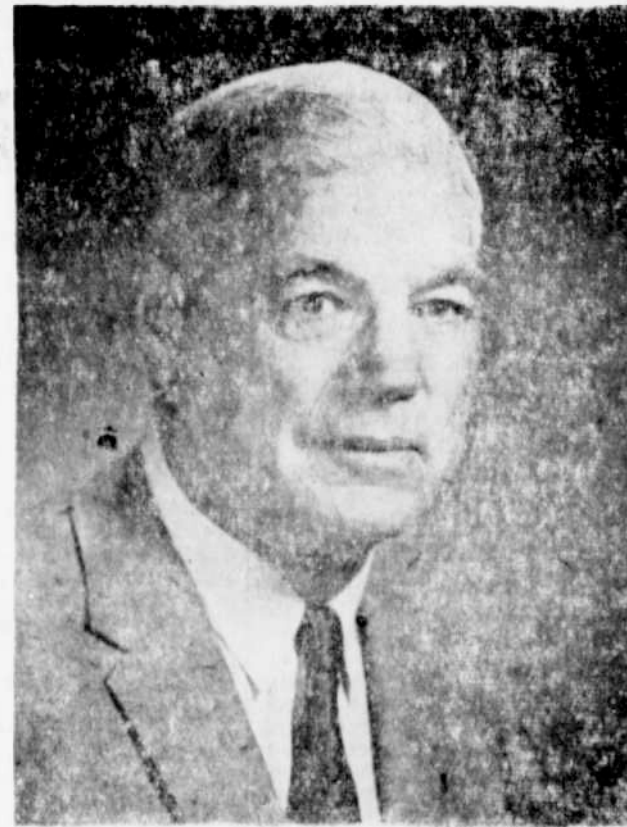
