Conservation Meeting Set

Major soil and water problems will come in for an airing when supervisors and cooperators of Oregon's 57 soil conservation districts, including Adrian's, gather in Baker Tuesday through next Friday for their association's 10th annual meeting, according to Harry Wakefield, unit conservationist for the Adrian district.

Ralph Wilson, Salem, president of the Oregon Association of Soil Conservation districts, which provides, through local districts, technical and other services to farmers and ranchers, called the meeting a "key one in view of pressing land problems."

Don Fredericksen, Gooding, Ida., rancher and a director of the National Association of Soil Conservation districts, will be the speaker at the annual banquet next Thursday night.

On the legislative side, supervisors are expected to introduce a resolution asking the state legislature to provide funds to employ part-time, sub-professional engineering and conservation help for the state's soil conservation districts.

Committee chairmen include Ray Duncan, Ironside, of the legislation committee.

County Libraries Report Busy Month

Malheur county's libraries spent a busy month in October, according to their month-end report released this week.

Some 598 new books were added at the county library, including 218 in the "schools department". A total of 5,203 books were circulated from the county library with 761 being circulated during the month from Nyssa's public library. Some 1,204 volumes were circulated from the bookmobile and 736 from Vale's public library.

In addition, the county library answered some 202 requests during October for information.
