Home Extension Service Interest Up in County

Figures reveal sharply increased activities in this year's home extension program according to Mrs. Edna Mae Wimsatt, county extension agent, who is currently preparing her annual summary.

The report shows that 527 leaders were trained in several different projects pertaining to home management and community life. These projects included food and nutrition, clothing, color and color harmony in home furnishings and civil defense. The leaders gave this same information to over 2500 homemakers in Malheur county.

Another figure revealed that more than 75 women actually had an opportunity to decide whether custom or machine tailoring techniques met their needs. These women made suits and coats for themselves and realized a total savings of approximately \$2,000.

Other savings were evident but not recorded in the same manner as in the clothing field. Better buymanship is one phase included in practically every project Mrs. Wimsatt said.
