Miss Esther Howard, who has been serving as a nurse for the past five years in India, will be the special speaker Sunday, Nov. 23, in the morning worship service at the Church of the Nazarene. Miss Howard served as director of the nursing school in the Reynolds Memorial hospital in Basim, Bombay State.

A special offering will be received in this service as a part of the goal of the denomination to raise \$1,000,000 for missions in the Thanksgiving offering. In a similar offering last Easter over \$1,039,000 was given for world wide missions.

In this golden anniversary year new missionary fields have been opened in West Germany and Brazil with Northern Rhodesia to be the next. The local church aids the support of 393 full time missionaries and 1,490 native workers in the 40 missionary fields of the Church of the Nazarene.
