Funeral services were conducted Saturday in Jordan Valley for Domingo Yturri, 74, who died in an Ontario hospital last Wednesday.

Mr. Yturri, father of State Sen. Anthony Yturri and Louis Yturri, both of Ontario, was born July 6, 1884, in Regoitia, Vizcaya, Spain, and came to the U.S. in 1903, settling in Delamar, Ida. He went to Jordan Valley in 1913 where he had made his home since. He operated the Helm and Yturri Mercantile in Jordan Valley until retiring several years ago.

He was a member of the Catholic church and Elks lodge of Ontario.
