Medical Costs Of Welfare Cases Rise in March

Medical care costs for recipients of public welfare in Malheur county rose sharply in March and were directly responsible for an over all increase of \$1,327.04 over February, it was reported by Mrs. Roberta Hubbard, county administrator. Payments totaling \$37,641.23 were made to or on behalf of 408 eligible persons. Of that total, \$9,643.52 was for medical care as opposed to \$6,133.44 in February.

The beginning of seasonal agricultural employment was reflected in a decrease in temporary assistance for food and shelter, Mrs. Hubbard said. In February, 74 families received \$4,268.36. In March 58 families received \$2,545.45, a decrease of 40 percent. This decline more than offset some slight increases in other types of assistance, resulting in a decrease of \$2,183.04 of 7 percent in money payments to recipients for food, clothing and shelter.

There were in March 225 recipients of old age assistance, 55 families with dependent children, 55 disabled persons and 14 children received care in foster homes. In addition to those listed above, child welfare services were extended to 39 other persons.
