Game Commission To Develop Three Hunters' Islands

Oregon hunters may find some good waterfowl and maybe some fair upland gunning in the near future on three Snake river islands in this district. These islands are Patch, Porters, and Hoffman, titles of which were recently

transferred to the Oregon Game commission through the Idaho Power company as partial compensation for waterfowl damage created by the Brownlee dam.

All three islands hold considerable potential for waterfowl and upland game bird developments. Patch island is already undergoing improvements, but title transfers of the other two came too late to proceed with much development work this year.

Largest of the three islands is Patch island, located just upstream from the Weiser bridge, containing about 83½ acres. Since the soils are productive and irrigation possible, probable developments will consist mainly of food production. Cover plantings for nesting purposes will also be developed.

Porters island is located four miles downstream from Patch island and is about 80 acres in size. The island offers excellent game management potential since the soils are fairly productive. Again

food plantings will probably be the major development, in addition to edge plantings for nesting and escape cover.

Some 12 miles downstream is Hoffman island, long and narrow,

containing about 55 acres. This island is the least productive in terms of food production but has excellent potential as a waterfowl nesting island. During maximum pool of the Brownlee reservoir, Hoffman island will barely be above high waterline.

Hunters intending to use the islands during the fall hunts will have to go by boat since there is no other public access.
