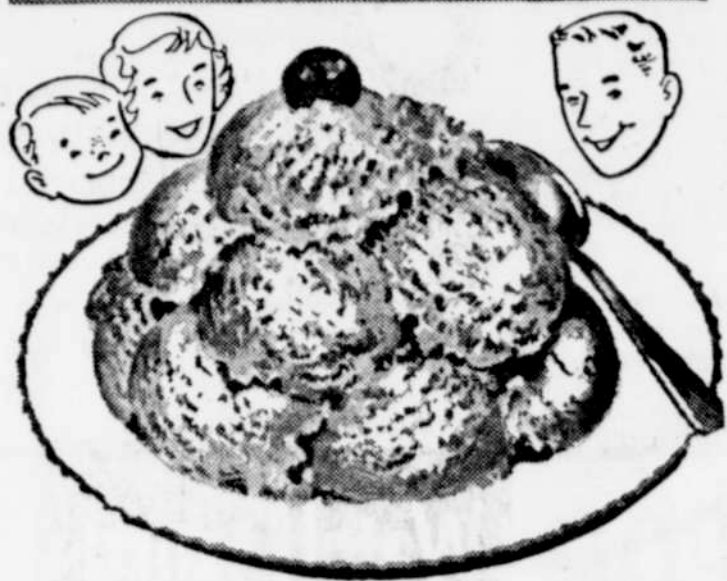

Nyssa High School to Host District 7 Track and Field Athletes Saturday

Saturday Nyssa hosts the annual District 7 A2 track and field meet. Preliminaries will begin at the high school at 10 a.m.

First and second place winners in 14 events will be eligible to compete in the state meet at Corvallis May 22 and 23.

Schools competing will be Nyssa, Vale, Mac high of Milton-Freewater, Enterprise, Madras, Elgin, Burns, Lakeview and John Day.

Coach Kinsey Keveren said he expects several Nyssa athletes to qualify for the state meet, and that some district records may fall.

Sprinter Don Walker has a 9.9 second mark for the 100-yard dash this season, best of any sprinter in Class 2A. He will also compete in the 220-yard dash.

Jim Moore has put the shot 47 feet, and is expected to show well Saturday. Norman Baker has run the half mile in 2:06, bettering his record mark of 1:10.1 set last year.

Dave Sewright and Bruce Fife are a one-two threat in the broad jump. Both have jumped more than 20 feet this season.

Nyssa high school athletes hold records in half the 14 events which make up the annual competition, an enviable record in anyone's book. Local record holders their marks, and year set, are: 100-yard dash, Larry Schenk, 10.1, 1957; 220-yard dash, Gerald Talbot, 23.5, 1958; 880-yard run, Norman Baker, 2:10.1, 1958; mile run, Tim McGinnis, 4:54.3, 1958; discus, Dennis Forbes, 140.2, 1957; 880-yard relay, Don Walker, Glenn Walker, Larry Roberts and Gerald Talbot, 1:34.0, 1958.

Other District 7 records are, 440-yard dash, 53.4; 120-yard high hurdles, 16.6; 180-yard low hurdles, 22.3; shot put, 48.8½; javelin, 186.2½; high jump, 5-10-3/8; pole vault, 10.9; broad jump, 20.4½.

Ontario Takes 1st In Annual Meet; Nyssa Places 2nd

The Ontario Tigers scored 51 points Saturday to win the Snake River Valley class A league track meet at Nyssa high school. Nyssa, led by Don Walker's double win in the 100 and 220 yard dashes, placed second with 36 points. Emmett followed with 31, Vale 30½, Meridian 11½, Weiser 3, and Payette 2.

First place winners for Nyssa were Walker, Baker in the 880-broad jump. Sewright also placed third in the high jump.

Nyssa's J. Moore placed second in the shot put, and the Nyssa 440-yard relay team placed second.

Others scoring for Nyssa were Jayo in the 440, Spitz in the high hurdles, D. Moore in the discus, and Zink in the pole vault.

Nyssa's 880-yard and mile relay teams came in fourth.

Hearings Precede Big Game Rules Making Session

Oregon hunters are advised that the 1959 seasons for hunting elk, deer, and antelope will be established by the game commission following a public hearing to be held May 22 at the commission's Portland office, 1634 S.W. Alder.

A new law passed by the Oregon legislature now gives the game commission authority to set the big game seasons prior to July. The scheduled May meeting date was selected by the commission for the big game hearing since all biological information on the status of Oregon's big game herds will be complete and assembled by that time.

By setting the big game hunting rules in May, the commission will have ample time to publish the hunting regulations, release other pertinent information, and to hold the various big game drawings well in advance of the seasons. Big game hunters will
