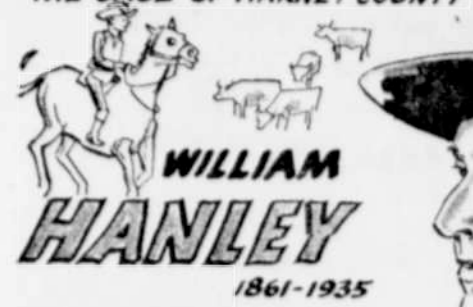

needs: brush control, 964,000 acres; reseeding, 438,000 acres; fencing, 1730 miles; checks, 8400; detention dams, 67; dikes, 135,000 feet; diversions, 42; reservoirs, 571; springs, 383; wells, 64; pipelines, 100,000 feet; cattle guards, 132; truck trails, 1175 miles, and dune control, 18,500 acres.

Estimated cost of these conservation and improvement needs is \$14,275,000.

Since 1954 the BLM in the Vale Grazing district has completed 3240 acres sagebrush spraying, 11,426 acres of range reseeding, 283.5 miles of fencing developments and 10 wells. In addition to these projects many reservoirs, springs and truck trails have been maintained and several minor projects such as cattle guards have been completed.

Fulwider said the total cost of these projects was \$357,292 with the range users contributing \$141,748 or approximately 40 percent of the total cost.
