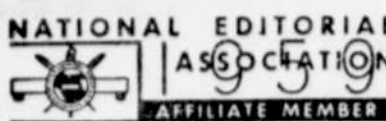

Beginning Monday, July 6, St. Bridget's Catholic church will present another course of religion or inquiry class which is open to the public.

These classes for adults will be held on Monday and Friday from 8 to 9 p.m. and are intended to give a basic course in faith and morality.

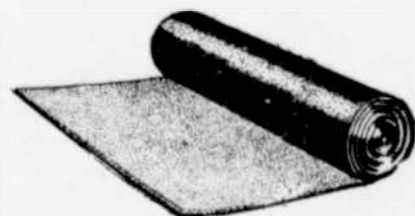

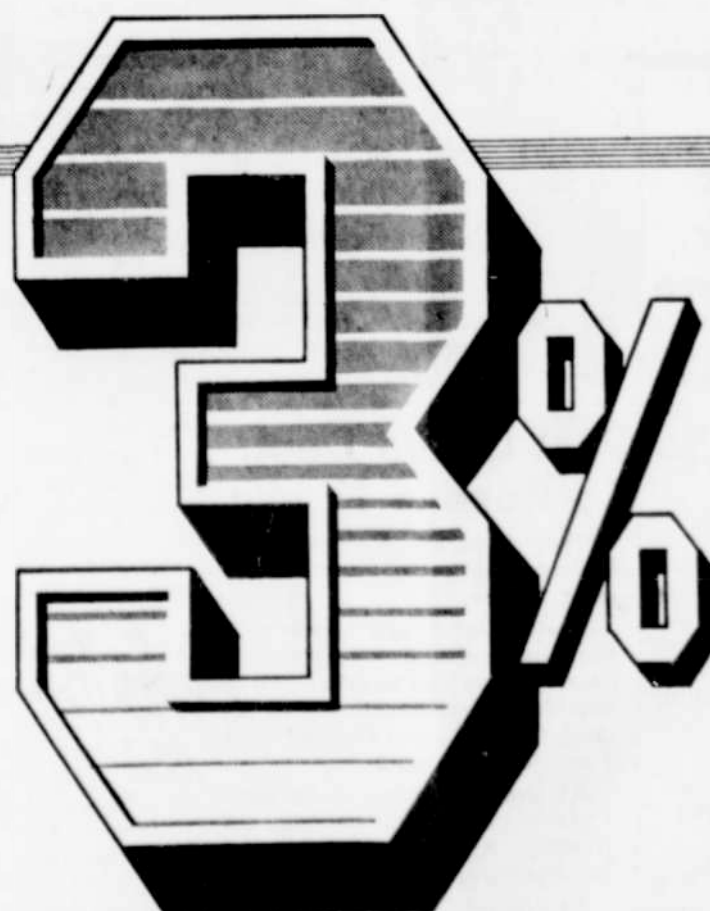
